Answer THREE Questions

1. 'In the areas of derogation from enunciated rights in international treaties and the protection of non-derogable rights, international judicial approaches demonstrate a lack of coherence and common vision' – Ní Aoláin. Discuss, drawing on the example of judicial or quasi-judicial bodies established under two or more treaties.
2. Does international humanitarian law provide an appropriate framework for regulating internal armed conflicts?
3. Can the Dayton Agreement be said to represent a coherent, workable solution to the conflict in Bosnia Herzegovina?
4. Has the International Criminal Tribunal on the Former Yugoslavia been both a legal and a political success?
5. 'Amnesties in post-conflict situations are neither desirable nor lawful' - Discuss, examining the relevant international law, and the practice in two or more jurisdictions.
6. 'Legal and political ambiguity are inevitable in contemporary peace processes' – Discuss, drawing on experiences in at least three conflict situations.
